

HSV Owners Club of WA – Show ‘n’ Shine Rules and Judging Criteria

Eligibility and Participation

The HSV Owners Club of Western Australia invites all financial members to participate in our Show ‘n’ Shine events. Eligible vehicles include HSV, HDT, and Chevrolet models. Whether your pride and joy is a daily driver, a weekend cruiser, or a garage-kept classic, there’s a category for you.

Vehicles do not need to be highly modified or restored—factory-spec cars are equally welcome.

General Rules

- Vehicles must be presented in a clean and well-maintained condition.
- Display presentation should reflect personal pride in ownership and represent the quality of the HSV brand, the Club, and its sponsors.
- Event setup and arrival times will be advised in advance. Vehicles must be parked and ready for judging by the specified time on the day.
- Category minimums:
 - A category must have at least 3 entrants to be judged.
 - Second place will only be awarded if 5 or more vehicles are entered in that category.

Competition Categories

Concourse Class

- Vehicles that are either current models or have travelled less than 5,000 km per annum (average) over their lifetime.
- Best Concourse – First Place
- Best Concourse – Runner-up

Show ‘n’ Shine Class

- Vehicles that have travelled between 5,000 km and 10,000 km per annum (average).
- Best Show ‘n’ Shine – First Place
- Best Show ‘n’ Shine – Runner-up

Daily Driven Class

- Vehicles that have travelled more than 10,000 km per annum (average).
- Best Daily Driven – First Place
- Best Daily Driven – Runner-up

Modified Class

- Open to vehicles with at least five (5) significant visual modifications, which may include: Forced induction systems (e.g., turbo or supercharger), aftermarket wheels or suspension, custom audio setups, modified interiors, or custom paintwork.
- Entrants must select this category on the entry form. Modifications will be assessed at the judges' discretion. Judging is done only against other modified vehicles, and no scoring adjustments will be made for the degree of modification.
- Best Modified – First Place
- Best Modified – Runner-up

People's Choice Award

- Determined by votes from fellow members and the public, submitted via anonymous paper ballots.
- Voting for your own vehicle is prohibited. Any self-voting will result in instant disqualification.
- People's Choice Award

Judging Criteria

Category	Judging Areas	Points
Exterior	Paintwork, glass, lights, panel alignment, trim, decals	20
Wheels, Tyres & Brakes	Cleanliness, blemishes, wear, brake condition	10
Engine Bay	Bonnet underside, firewall, engine, belts, hoses, labels, fittings	20
Interior	Dashboard, seats, carpets, console, trim, headlining, boot area, rubbers, hinges	30
Chassis	Undercarriage, suspension components, sump, inner guards, fuel tank	20

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

- ****How is vehicle eligibility determined for categories based on annual travel?****

Odometer readings are self-declared during registration but will also be verified by judges during the event.

- ****What qualifies a vehicle for the Modified Class?****

Entrants must nominate this class on the entry form. Judges will confirm the presence of at least five significant modifications, at their discretion. No bonus points are applied for modification complexity.

- ****Who conducts the judging?****

Judging will be performed by Club Committee members and invited guests, including major sponsors. All judges receive a formal briefing to ensure consistency and fairness.

- ****Can I enter my car in more than one category?****



No. Entrants must select only one category and are encouraged to consider their competition carefully before choosing.

- **How does People's Choice voting work?**

Votes are collected anonymously via a locked ballot box on the day. Self-voting is strictly prohibited and will result in disqualification.

- **Will there be awards for Best Paint, Engine Bay, or Interior?**

No additional individual awards will be offered beyond the listed trophies.
